

Result - fewer cases being ignored, closed prematurely or written off as "civil in nature" Less opportunity for the standard misconceptions to block an investigation



Types of Elder Abuse





•EMTs & paramedics are the most underused witnesses - but sometimes can be the most effective





- They hear & see things that NO-ONE else observes
- They are often walking into a crime sceneThey make GREAT witnesses











CHECKLIST FOR EMT TRAINING

- •Who called 911 demeanor?
- Any delay in calling
- •Any sign of body having been moved
- •Any indicators of drug/alcohol use
- •Victim may be willing to "talk" in ambulance away from suspect





AND THEN TRAIN THE DISPATCHERS What questions to ask on the call How to handle a call from an elder who may be in shock





REACH OUT TO EVERY E.R/URGENT CARE/CLINIC Remind them of mandated reporting duties

The fight against senior scams

'Financial abuse' is now officially a U.S. publichealth concern. Inside the movement to get it under control—and what's slowing it down.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention might be best known for its efforts to combat obesity, or Zika, or the H1N1 flu virus. But last year, it drew new attention to a hazard that doesn't sound like a disease at all.

The hazard is "senior financial abuse," meaning the theft of older people's resources by someone they trust. Alarmed by the growing cost of the



problem and the lack of a clear strategy to combat it, the CDC included in a first-of-its-kind report a definition for what constitutes the financial exploitation of old people. It includes fraud, breach of personal trust, poor investment advice, or improper use of power of attorney.





Elder Financial Abuse Is a 'Virtual Pandemic,' and on the Rise

Local fraud expert says incidences of elder financial exploitation are up 30 to 40 percent since the COVID-19 pandemic began.

The COVID-19 pandemic is exacerbating a growing problem for seniors in the United States: elder financial abuse. With the elderly more isolated from their loved ones that ever, they are becoming more susceptible to losing their savings to clever fraudsters. The *New England Journal of Medicine* <u>called</u> the problem a "virtual epidemic" in 2015, and healthcare providers can help identify the problem.





GDS[®] TECHNICIAN PLEADS GUILTY TO FELONIES

n a first for the garage door industry, a technician has been convicted of multiple felonies, all pertaining to nothing more than his garage door repair work. The case may have repercussions for garage door repair companies that charge high rates for garage door repair work.

On July 7, Tim Patterson, 44, former leading technician for GDS, pleaded guilty in Superior Court of San Diego County to four felony counts of "elder financial abuse." In California, such a felony involves the theft of more than \$950 from someone over 65. By pleading guilty, Patterson avoided a jury trial and likely influenced a lesser sentence from 2016 and, upon being made aware, ensured he was no longer an employee with our business.

"We have received complaints from former customers of Mr. Patterson's, and in nearly all instances the business reached a satisfactory resolution. We encourage anyone who believes they were treated unfairly by Mr. Patterson to contact us so we can work towards resolving any complaints."

AG Josh Stein pushing for mandatory scam awareness training for retailers

North Carolina Attorney General Josh Stein said his office is renewing pushes to crack down on scam calls.

"We're reaching out to the retailers so that they train their clerks in how to spot this," Stein said. "Most of these companies, they want to protect their customers too. It's just important that we educate them about the role they're playing in the defrauding of them and then they can actually take concrete steps to mitigate and prevent this kind of fraud."




