

Driven by a calling, Nicole Howell dedicates her career to the memories and experiences of her grandma — a Native American facing struggles as a person who spoke English as a second language.

In her grandma's legacy, over a decade-long career began in the nonprofit and then aging communities to fill a void by building programs, teams, and infrastructures, and providing resources to educate and combat the ageism impacting older adults. Nicole has helped cultivate change through the belief that there is both power and equity in shared leadership. She believes that powerful leadership is met with equal parts enthusiasm, engagement, and connection to the team and those she is privileged to work with.

As the Executive Director for Empowered Aging, Nicole is responsible for ensuring that the nearly 29,000 long-term care residents, countless seniors, and their families have access to the highest level of care and respect and, above all, can live free of abuse and neglect.

She has created, launched, and leads a variety of programs that support this mission, including Friendly Visiting and Telephone Reassurance to combat isolation, the Elder Justice Lunch and Learn webinar series to enhance the work of senior service professionals (a program that has reached more than 5,000 individuals in 46 states and four countries - in it's first year), and the Healthcare Career Pathway, an innovative workforce development initiative designed to meet the critical shortage of qualified, certified nursing assistants. And that's just the beginning.

"I've always had a passion for the nonprofit community, but when I became part of the ombudsman services in my prior role as the Director of Operations for Ombudsman Services of San Mateo County, something just clicked. It ignited a connection and those experiences I saw my grandma facing. I quickly became a fierce advocate for seniors and adults with disabilities and was driven to immerse myself in culture-changing initiatives and personcentered care philosophies. It's a true honor to use my voice for all of those in long-term care — residents, their families, and those who have passed. Really, it's not just a community. It's a movement of people."



Since becoming Executive Director, Nicole has grown Empowered Aging's budget nearly 600%, lowered the use of anti-psychotics in Contra Costa County by 10%, and increased facility coverage by unearthing the problems and issues that are being overlooked. She has helped spearhead many new programs, including the Elder Justice Program Solano, Telephone Reassurance, and Friendly Visiting in Solano County, as well as Healthcare Career Pathways and Residents' Rights in Contra Costa.

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, Nicole and her team distributed PPE to 15,000 residents in long-term care. They also participated in efforts for residents' rights by collaborating with local reporters to spread the word on the risks facing the vulnerable older adult population. After the height of the pandemic, Nicole and her team were the first to reenter long-term care facilities and spearheaded the return of ombudsmen back to the field.

Serving thousands of older adults and adults with disabilities across the Bay Area, Empowered Aging is a nonprofit organization dedicated to representing the interests that impact our isolated senior community. Nicole and her team believe aging is a natural phase of life, deserving of respect and dignity. Every day they empower, educate, and partner with older adults and adults with disabilities to best meet their unique needs – from providing opportunities to stay connected to the activities they love to ensuring they are free from neglect and abuse. Because when our elders thrive, we all benefit from their unique contributions and collective wisdom.
