# Why are Elders Targeted?

- Lifetime of savings
- Generation believes trust
- Reluctant use internet for "due diligence"
- Lonely
- Physical frailty can cause overestimating decision making
- Afraid to admit their "mistakes"





## Why Don't Cases Get Prosecuted?

- Examples of scams
- Underreported
- Criminal perspective intent, proof
- Civil perspective not economically viable, collectability problems





### Recovering From a Co-Conspirator: Lee Loomis, Loomis Wealth Solutions

- Investment opportunity
  - Real estate
  - Promised 12% return
  - "Equity harvest" your existing home equity
  - Also buy life insurance for tax advantages

- Life Insurance company seeking bought
- Issuing policies without doing suitability analysis
- Everyone getting same policy amounts
- Co-conspirator liability





### Recovering From State Bar Fund James Walker, Senior Care Advocates

- Attorney selling fear abatement
- Exaggerated % people needing snf, cost and time in snf
- Sold same thing to everyone for \$10,000-\$20,000
- Bogus advice and "Lifetime Services"
- Prosecuted, disbarred





### Recovering from California DRE Seth Depiano

- Fraudulent RE investments
- Ponzi scheme
- California Department of Real Estate
  - Paid by license renewals
  - \$250,000 cap
  - Highly technical requirements
  - Often hired by victims who tried to submit claims on their own





# Recovering from Government Settlements: Western Union & MoneyGram

- Fraudsters love wire transfers
- Typical frauds include fake lottery, prizes, inheritances, emergencies, investments and romance scams
- Wire transfer companies know about fraud
- Government prosecutes get large funds
- Problem getting money to victims
- Problem victims no longer have their proof
- We helped recover \$4m+ for victims





# **How to Help Victims?**



- Internet research
- Urge fraud victims or families to talk with a civil attorney
- Civil attorney questions:
  - Experience representing seniors?
  - Past results?
  - No cost and risk-free contingency basis?

- Falls
- Medication Errors
- Wandering
- Suicides
- Wrongful Deaths



### **Helpful Investigation Efforts**

- Seek Evidence of Systemic Failings
- Insufficient Staffing
  - Total number staff hours available
  - Acuity of residents
  - Turnover/supervision problems
- Prior similar incidents or citations
